
CONSTRUCTION ALERT: PIPELINE RELINING PROJECT STARTS IN THE FALL

To ensure you have a reliable, high-quality water supply, the second phase of construction starts on our 40-inch diameter water transmission pipeline this fall. We are relining the pipeline during the lower water demand time of the year to reduce customer impact.

The 11,000-foot-long pipeline alignment travels along several highly trafficked streets and through some customers' backyards. We will contact our directly-impacted customers to inform them about the construction activity and necessary easement access. Construction begins this fall and is expected to be completed in the summer of 2018.

This project is part of our capital improvement program. As always, our top priority is to complete this project in a timely, cost-effective manner, while minimizing construction and customer impacts.






