

HEADS UP! YOUR RATES CHANGE JANUARY 1

In April 2017, a five-year schedule of water rate changes was adopted. This January will be the third rate increase as part of this five-year plan. As of January 1, 2019, your daily base rate will include an eight percent increase. The volumetric rate will remain at \$0.92 for each 748 gallons of water used. The remaining two installments will occur in January 2020 and 2021. These rate adjustments will:


- Fund necessary capital replacement projects
- Maintain and improve financial stability
- Meet required debt service obligations
- Maintain Board-adopted reserve levels
- Meet increased regulatory demands

YOUR WATER RATES Where your money goes

Your water rates include a daily fixed charge and a water use charge. The daily fixed charge is based on the size of each customer's water meter and is intended to recover a proportionate share of the fixed costs associated with operating and maintaining the system. The use charge is based on a uniform water usage rate multiplied by each customer's individual water use.

WATER EFFICIENCY DOESN'T STOP INDOORS

Try these tips to save \$\$\$ on your water bill in cooler months.



Reduce water use on your landscape. This is an obvious tip but easily overlooked! During the winter months, remember to turn off your irrigation system. Unless the weather is unseasonably dry, Mother Nature typically takes care of your landscape irrigation needs.



Remove your natural grass lawn. Another water saving option is replacing your traditional cool season turf grass with turf grass alternatives and ground cover plant options. These plants are well-suited for our region's climate.



Mulch more. As soil temperatures drop, mulch insulates plants and holds in moisture. For a winter crop, this is beneficial to prevent the plant from freezing over.



Wrap your pipes. When you start seeing a drop in temperature, make sure your pipes are wrapped. This will help you avoid a pipe bursting. A burst pipe wastes a substantial amount of water plus, can causes a large plumbing bill.
