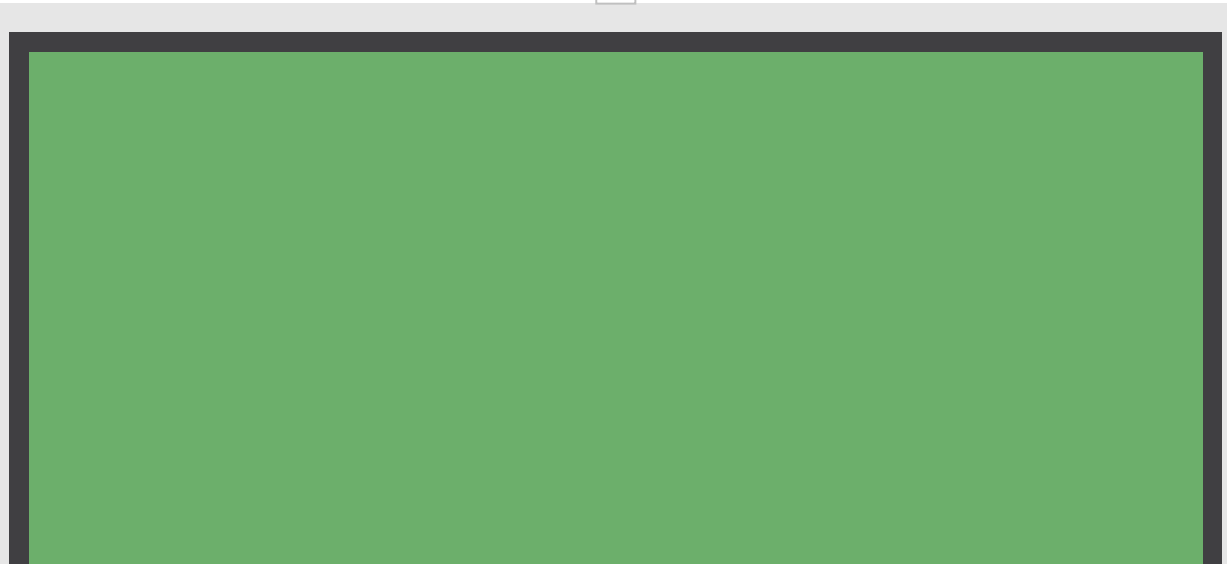

Division-Based Elections Effective in 2022

San Juan Water District holds elections for members of its five-member Board of Directors every two years on a staggered schedule. Two positions will be voted on in November 2020 under the current “at-large” election process – meaning all voters in San Juan’s wholesale service area can vote for all candidates running to fill the open positions on the Board.

Effective in 2022, three directors will be voted on through a division-based process, the first by-division election for San Juan Water District. On May 13, 2020, the District’s Board of Directors adopted a resolution declaring its intent to initiate procedures to transition from at-large elections to division-based elections.

The Board of Directors is holding public hearings to provide additional customer participation opportunities. Are You Overwatering?



Summer is in full swing which usually means an increase in outdoor water use. Your irrigation system is probably working its hardest to keep up, but that may mean you are overwatering. Overwatering causes water runoff, which leads to higher water bills and water waste.

Check to see if your irrigation system has any broken water lines, leaking valves or missing spray heads by performing an audit of your system. Here's how:

Reduce Run-off with Cycle-and-Soak Method

If you have a traditional non-weather based sprinkler system, the cycle and soak method of watering your yard is a great way to control how much water you are using. Program your sprinkler timer to water in three- to four-minute intervals one hour apart. Soil absorbs water better this way and the cycle/soak method reduces water run-off. Follow these steps to improve outdoor water

use:

- **Check soil moisture** to see if your yard needs water.
- **Cycle:** Run sprinklers for three minutes or until you see runoff.
- **Soak:** Wait one hour.
- **Repeat**, if needed, until moisture reaches the roots.
- **Program** your sprinkler timer to cycle and soak.

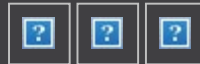
