About Us...

San Juan Water District, located in Granite Bay, California, is a community services district created by a vote of the citizens in 1954. The District provides wholesale water to more than 160,000 people and retail to 30,000 people living in eastern Sacramento and southern Placer Counties. The District wholesales water to Citrus Heights, Fair Oaks and San Juan (retail) Water Districts, Orange Vale Water Company and the City of Folsom with surplus treatment capacity available to Sacramento Suburban Water District. The District provides treatment and delivery of more than 50,000 acre-feet of water per year to wholesale and retail customers.

With rich history dating back to the Gold Rush era, the District has served the community for more than 150 years. The District's highest priority is to provide reliable, high-quality water to its customers – every day, year in and year out. The District is significantly involved in reshaping California's water dialogue. San Juan Water District is led by a five-member board of directors who are elected by the community to provide guidance, strategy, and policy for district programs and policies.

The Position...

The Pump Station Lead is part of the Field Services team, responsible for supervising the general maintenance and operation of booster pump stations and water storage facilities and operating and managing the distribution system pressure zones. Duties include:

- Monitoring, interpreting and making appropriate set point changes to water pressure via Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system and maintaining distribution system efficiency logs.

- Planning, supervising, and coordinating preventative maintenance and repair projects for District booster pump stations, pressure reducing valves, standby generators and Kokila Reservoir, Los Lagos and Mooney Tanks and equipment.
- Maintaining accurate logs utilizing CMMS; inspecting and adjusting pump station equipment on a scheduled or as needed basis; researching and ordering equipment, tools, and parts as needed.
- Supervising the District's monthly Distribution Sample Monitoring and associated reporting.
- Taking bacteriological samples and conducting standardized tests for chlorine residual using chemical testing tools and equipment.
- Maintaining and sending reports on a monthly/quarterly basis to the State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water (DDW).
- Supervising the Cross Connection Control Program and overseeing the testing of the District's residential and commercial backflows; conducting cross connection control surveys on a scheduled or as needed basis.
- Overseeing service personnel providing customer service, USA support and contractor coordination related to the water distribution system.
- Assisting Distribution Lead Workers with their duties, when requested.

The Ideal Candidate...

To be considered, candidates should be knowledgeable of principles and practices of technical and functional supervision, general and specific principles of water distribution system hydraulics, and the operation and maintenance of pump stations and pressure reducing stations. The qualifications include:

Graduation from high school or equivalent supplemented with training in water quality and distribution system principles and practices and three years of experience performing duties equivalent to a Distribution Operator IV with San Juan Water District.

Possession of a valid California motor vehicle operator's class C license.

Possession of a Grade IV Water Distribution Operator Certificate and Grade II Water Treatment Operator Certificate from the State of California.

Compensation and Benefits...

The salary range is \$44.52 - \$53.43. In addition, the District offers competitive benefits which include District contribution to CalPERS retirement, medical, dental and vision for employee and dependents; post-employment health insurance; District paid life insurance; 12 paid days of sick leave; 11 paid holidays; and paid vacation depending on length of service.
